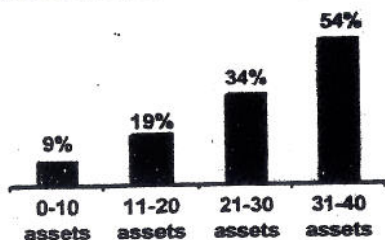


The Power of Developmental Assets™

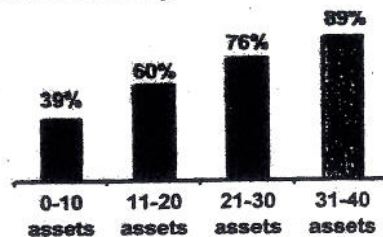

The Power of Assets to Promote Positive Attitudes and Behaviors

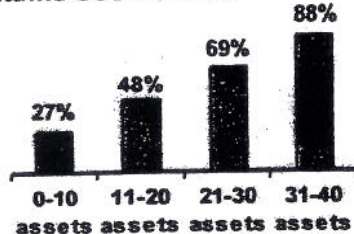

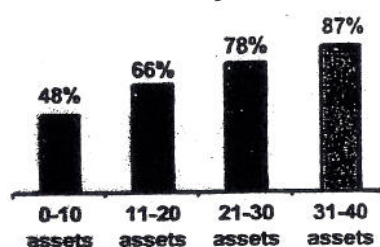

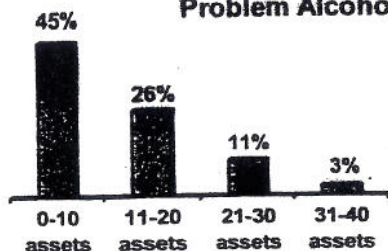

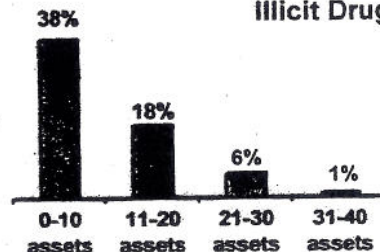

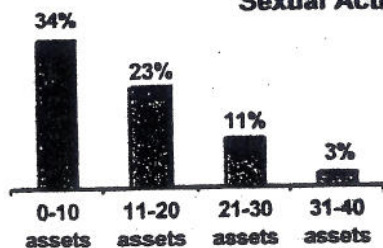
