Fun in the Sun completes jam-packed summer

Carpinteria kids flocked to United Way's Fun in the Sun (FITS) this summer to experience seven, jam-packed weeks of learning, playing and enrichment at the Girls Inc. of Carpinteria site. The program, which ran from June 22 to Aug. 7 at four sites in Santa Barbara County, is a collaborative summer enrichment program, involving partners from nearly 60 public and private agencies. This year marked Fun in the Sun's third summer in Carpinteria, giving 78 kids from low-income families a summer of fun learning activities and field trips.

Each day, campers completed standards-based, academic work as well as many fun, high-energy activities. FITS-Carpinteria children went fishing (for many, it was the first time in their lives), grew their own vegetables, played sports, swam at the public pool and visited with senior citizens from the Friendship Center's GOLD Project. Through a lunchtime mentoring program, FITS kids paired up with adults from local businesses who served as role models for the youths.

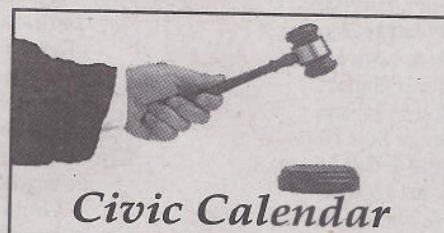


John Balch takes the reigns as President of the United Boys & Girls Clubs board of directors.
