

Real Cost Measure = more accurate measure of who is struggling in California

About the Real Cost Measure

Real Cost Measure = more accurate measure of who is struggling in California

Real Cost Measure incorporates the cost of housing, food, health care, child care, & other basic needs

Focus is on working households

State, regional, county, and neighborhood-level data

Nearly 1,200 household budgets by household size for every CA county

Real Cost Measure Methodology

Population Focus	Households
Housing	Fair Market Rent Rates Dept. of Housing and Urban Development
Food	Low Cost Food Plan Dept. of Housing and Urban Development
Child care	CA Department of Education
Health care	Consumer Expenditure Survey
Transportation	Consumer Expenditure Survey
Miscellaneous	10% of Basic Needs
Taxes	Federal/State Taxes/Payroll Taxes & Child Care and Child Tax Credits



How much does a family below the Real Cost Measure in Santa Barbara County need to stay afloat?




What Does it Cost to Live in CA?


Household Budgets Change with Family Size



More than 1 in 3 households in California (37%) struggle to meet basic needs







Percentage of Households below Real Cost Measure








Percent below Real Cost Measure by Ethnicity




Estimated Households below Real Cost Measure by Ethnicity




Over 7 in 10 Single Mothers in the Santa Barbara County (77%) struggle to meet basic needs




Housing Burden in California












